Importance of emotional attachment

Attachment is the unique emotional relationship between your baby and you, their primary caretaker. It is a key factor in the way your infant's brain organizes itself and how your child develops socially, emotionally, intellectually, and physically. The quality of the attachment bond varies.

As we know it starts from emotional attachment, if we are attached to anyone emotionally then we will try our best to help them physically, by showing some love or care through physical touch like hugs and kisses. Here are some examples of babies developing their emotional and then social skills.



Here a baby saw the other crying, he went close to him and started rocking him without being asked to do that, which shows his awareness for emotions, he knew that the other baby is not feeling good and he went there to sooth him to show empathy for him.

Here children were playing with the car, so we had only one car in the playground and they both were crying for it, then the educator talked and showed how they can share one car by taking turns and even helping each other riding that car. They understood and followed it. It was really nice to see this in early age and is good for them for their better development of all their skills.



All of the examples above shows that even though babies are young, they are infants but they can learn and understand if we talk to them and show them how things can work instead of doing everything for them.

Toddlers



The toddlers did not only enjoy the summer, but have also been engrossed in numerous activities in the classroom. Play is the key to toddlers' overall development as children learn through play. After observing the children in the classroom, we found that they have an interest in animals. We planned and implemented different activities to help support the children's interest. Some activities that we have implemented in the classroom are reading out different animal stories with appropriate actions and intonation, recognizing and naming different animals; imitating the sounds they make; creating different animal crafts such as a lion, a fish, and a turtle.

We will be exploring this through different pictures, stories, puzzles, and art activities. Through this we aim to enhance the toddlers' cognition, communication, emotional and social skills. Learning Fun

Our educators are continuing to contribute to your children's learning growth by incorporating individual sensory activities in the classroom! Sensory activities facilitate exploration and encourage children to use scientific processes while they play, create, and investigate. Spending time stimulating their senses helps children develop in various aspects!



You can join in all the exploration and learning fun too.

Try making "moonsand"! This activity can get messy, so make sure to have your child cover up with a smock, apron, or old t-shirt before starting. Have your child use their hands to mix 4 cups sand and 2 cups cornstarch in a bowl. Give them time to feel the two textures. Slowly pour in 1 cup of water as they are mixing and have them move the materials around until everything is combined. Ask, "What does it feel like?" Give them time to play with the moonsand and figure out what it can do.

Program Coordinators have been assigned to each centre. This role is new to Lullaboo and combines previous roles that contributed to the quality of our programming. This helps consolidate efforts and eliminates travel between centres for these specialized roles. Ms. Sabrina Abhimanu will be the dedicated Program Coordinator at your centre.

To recap Regional Health Guidelines; screening must be completed daily for all parents, caregivers and children before arrival at the centre. Parents/caregivers are to take your child(ren) temperature every morning.

Please call your child's classroom or the office (attached is an extension list) to report temperatures and answer daily screening questions. Once screening is passed, a staff will come outside to pick up your child(ren). A secondary and streamlined Lullaboo Health Check will be completed before taking your child(ren) to their classroom.

At pick-up, please call your child's classroom or office and we will bring your child(ren) outside to you. To ensure safety of all children, we ask you to bring your ID with you at all times when coming for pick-up. We have allowed our systems to take a photo of authorized pickups in order to make this easier for you. We ask for your help in coordinating this role out.

Municipalities have made masks a mandatory item which must be worn while in indoor public buildings. Lullaboo has created our own reusable mask, should you wish to have one please ask your centre supervisor and they would be happy to provide you with one. **These masks are free of charge** while supplies last. We hope this helps contribute to our families' health and safety while outside of our centres.


**Baby On Board Car Signs
